Fourth Semester Hebrew Course Requirement

- The fourth semester Hebrew competency may be met by the successful completion of JUS 203B with a grade of "C" or better, or by successfully completing the UA's official Credit by Exam process for 203B.
- Competency may also be met by fourth semester proficiency with a grade of "C" or better in those foreign languages spoken by Jewish communities as approved by the Judaic Studies Undergraduate Advisor. Other languages may include Arabic, Farsi, French, German, Italian, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, and Turkish.
